For: Secondary Subject Leaders and aspiring Subject Leaders

Focus: Department leadership of subject specific teaching and learning

In essence: A subject-based peer network for subject leaders to reawaken their love of teaching their subject, develop a strong department in order to inspire pupils and improve results

Aims:

Empower Subject Leaders to be advocates for their subjects and to introduce pupils, regardless of their background or ability, to challenging and enriching materials and activities by:

- Developing a challenging, innovative and enriching curriculum
- Enthusing pupils through subject-based activities beyond the curriculum
- Enriching the subject knowledge and impact of all teachers within the department
- Encouraging links within and beyond school including universities and professional bodies

How does it work?

There are three levels to The PTI Subject Leadership Programme. Participants can choose when to move to the next level:

- 1. Subject Leadership Development Plan
- 2. Subject Leadership Action Research
- 3. Subject Leadership Extended Enrichment

The criteria for the award of The PTI Mark are:

Contribution to network: attendance at Subject Leadership Day to share ideas and to support colleagues with their projects/ objectives



Progression in development plan/ project (stages 1, 2 and 3) meeting annual objectives/ milestones and agreeing next steps to demonstrate an aspect of department improvement





Completion of project (stages 2 and 3): submitting a written report detailing the journey and impact of the project at its end point

What happens next...?

Each level can last between one and four years depending on ambition and context at the outset. There is flexibility built in to the structure to enable schools/ participants to move at an appropriate speed.
