He completed his PhD at Bristol University and lectured at Brunel University before moving on to develop television projects on geoscience. Iain has worked with BBC Science for 15 years making documentaries about the planet and is best known for the geography series *Earth: The Power of the Planet*. He is currently President of the Royal Scottish Geographical Society and the Devon Wildlife Trust. His current research interests are in natural hazards, geo-resources and sustainable development. Iain holds a UNESCO Chair in Geoscience and Society.
