Dr Hanno Balz, University of Cambridge

Hanno Balz teaches German and European Contemporary History as DAAD Lecturer at the University of Cambridge. He has also taught at Johns Hopkins University, Baltimore and at the universities of Lüneburg and Bremen. His fields of research are the history of social movements, cultural and media history, history of anticommunism, and the Shoah and Nazi rule and its legacy.



Prof Ingrid Sharp, University of Leeds

Ingrid Sharp is Professor of German Cultural and Gender History at the University of Leeds. She researches into gender representation and cultural history in Germany, with a particular emphasis on the First World War, the revolution of 1918 and Weimar Germany. Her research into women's role in the German Revolution of November 1918 forms the basis of a new play and exhibition that toured in the UK and Germany in 2018.

Workshops

Led by a practising teacher, ensuring relevance to you and your classroom

The Weimar years: Destined to fail? This workshop will strengthen your understanding of 1920s politics, complementing the GCSE curriculum whilst also exploring activities relevant to KS3 and KS5. A creative and active session, you'll discover the liberal city of Berlin during this era. Finally, learn interpretive essay writing approaches, considering German democracy over time.

Ostpolitik: Pinnacle or phoney rapprochement? This workshop takes a detailed look at Ostpolitik and its aftermath. You'll study historiography and sources, bringing to life the post-Nazi political arena in Germany. In addition, you will consider vast chronological changes from democracy to dictatorship, and strengthen your understanding of the politics of East and West Germany.

This day will be led by Philippa Edwards, History teacher at Woodlands School. Philippa has been teaching history since 2006, and was Head of Department at Greensward Academy for eight years. Philippa has been a Teacher Leader for the PTI for several years, co-planning and designing bespoke CPD for teachers across various historical topics.
