Elisabeth van Houts is Honorary Professor in European Medieval History at the University of Cambridge and a Fellow of Emmanuel College. Born in the Netherlands, she came to Cambridge as a postdoc in 1984. She has published extensively on Anglo-Norman history.

Professor van Houts will offer new interpretations of historical aspects including providing some source material and translations.
