Jeremy Black is Professor of History at the University of Exeter. After graduating with a starred First from Cambridge, he undertook research at Oxford. He is a prolific lecturer and writer, and is the author of over 100 books. Jeremy's work adds up to the most sustained presentation of British history in recent decades. He is a major exponent of military, diplomatic and cartographic history and has been important in helping the British to look at their past, and representing British history to foreign audiences.

Professor Gary Sheffield holds the Chair of War Studies at the University of Wolverhampton. He is an internationally-recognised expert on the First World War, especially the role of the British army. He has published many books and articles, including the best-selling *Forgotten Victory: The First World War - Myths and Realities* (2001, new edition, 2018). He shared the 2003 Templar Medal for his contribution to David French and Brian Holden Reid (eds.) *The British General Staff: Innovation and Reform* (2002).
