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Introduction

Members of school leadership teams can join The PTI Leadership Programme which focuses on whole school leadership to drive and support the improvement of education for all children regardless of background or ability.

This is achieved through three key themes: Ethos, Curriculum and People & Inclusion.

The programme asks participants to reflect on the context of their school and the key issues they face, devising an action plan for the year ahead (or even beyond).

Thinking is supported each year through three face-to-face days and three online sessions. This includes a one-to-one review each summer which will determine the award of The PTI Leadership Mark.



The **Principles**

All children are entitled to a challenging and enriching educational experience.

Teachers are the key to enhancing opportunities for young people, and their role in society should therefore be promoted.

Promoting the professional development of passionate and motivated teachers is the key to making education excellent for all.

Strengthening leadership skills across the school will drive whole school improvement.

A national network of school leaders seeking to make the greatest impact within their schools will benefit education beyond that scope.

Collaboration across and between schools builds optimism about the future.

Attending the events of the programme, conducting an in-school project, and attending a one to one review meeting to demonstrate impact of the programme, enables schools eligibility towards achieving The PTI Leadership Mark.



Participation

- Representation and engagement at each of the Leadership Programme events.
 - Two or more colleagues are welcome to join the events.
 - Different colleagues can join the events.



- The project should reflect your school priorities and also fulfil the aims of the programme.
- Completed projects are shared and celebrated through publication on The PTI website and inclusion in The PTI Yearbook.



Schools evidence progress and impact in two ways:

- Completing the Annual School Report a series of short written documents (School Context, Project Proposal, Progress Review and Impact Summary Report completed throughout the academic year).
- Participating in the online one to one End of Year Progress
 Review meeting whereby you can reflect on and celebrate
 the year past and set new priorities for the year ahead.
