Professor Stephen Roberts is Associate Professor and Reader in Modern Spanish Literature and Intellectual history and Head of the Department of Spanish, Portugese and Latin American Studies at the University of Nottingham. His research focuses on the literature and thought of Spain and Latin America in the period between the 1860s and the 1930s.

Dr Stuart Green is a Senior Lecturer in Spanish at the University of Leeds, where he teaches on Spanish cinema, theatre, music, literature and art from the seventeenth century to the present day. His research explores questions such as the relationship between theatre and cinema in the 1930s and 1940s, branding in contemporary theatre, performance styles on screen and stage, and questions of race and discrimination in the performing arts.
