Developing strong compositions in photography - Good pictures are seldom created by chance. The way you arrange the elements of a scene within a picture, catch the viewer's attention, please the eye, or make a clear statement are all qualities of good composition. Without the need to invest in any expensive equipment, you can produce photographs that suggest movement, life, depth, shape, and form, recreating the impact of the original scene. Appreciating the elements of good composition will undoubtedly enhance photographic work.

Making great pictures: Photographic characteristics - Along with developing an understanding of the fundamentals of photography this workshop will look at two core questions: What makes a photograph iconic? What three things must every picture have to stand out from any old snapshot? Discover how to inspire our students and show them that great pictures do not rely on equipment – but on being able to see and think critically about your surroundings.
