### An overview of the Art Enrichment Residential

Over the course of the Residential we aim to reaffirm the value of the arts through a knowledge and understanding of historical and contemporary concepts and practices, and to ensure access to the arts in schools is equitable. Exposure to the arts can unlock potential in young people, helping them to develop skills in communication, collaboration, creativity and problem-solving. We hope this Residential will give you the confidence in creating and delivering an arts-rich curriculum to ensure that art is accessible for all pupils irrespective of their background or ability.

40 years ago, the Calouste Gulbenkian Foundation published 'The Arts in Schools: Principles, practice and provision'. Four decades on from publication and 3 years on from the pandemic, it is even more crucial that these principles continue to be championed. The role of the arts in human experience – in what makes us whole and healthy and happy human beings – is even clearer than it was in the 1980s.

### Objectives of the course

- » Emphasise and promote consideration of why we teach art, the part it plays in developing practical skills, visual perception, and the power it has to shape the way we view a diverse society and culture.
- » Examine what role art partnerships, artist residencies and critical awareness, of both contemporary as well as historical genres, play in evolving our own practice.
- » Ensure every pupil has access to a rich and diverse art curriculum where they can explore visual, tactile and other sensory experiences by working with traditional and new media allowing them to develop their confidence, competence, imagination and creativity in order to communicate ideas and meanings through their own visual language.
- » Challenge ourselves as teachers to create dynamic and memorable classroom experiences through invigorating our passion for the subject and sharing best practice and insight.

### **KEYNOTE MARTIN CLAYTON**

Martin is Head of Prints and Drawings for Royal Collection Trust. He studied Natural Sciences and History of Art at Cambridge, and since 1990 has worked in the Print Room at Windsor Castle. He has organised many exhibitions on the drawings in the Royal Collection, most prolifically on those of Leonardo da Vinci.



### **DR LAUREN BARNETT**

Lauren is a London-based writer and lecturer focused on the representation of death in visual culture. Best known for her book 'Death Lines: Walking London Through Horror History' (2023), she has also written on horror cinema for Horrified Magazine and contributed to academic journals and books including 'Lacanian and Foucauldian Approaches to the Body' (2020).



### **MARK CAZALET**

Mark is a contemporary British artist based in London. He trained at Chelsea and Falmouth School of Art, after which he held two post graduate scholarships at L'Ecole des Beaux Arts in Paris and at M.S. University Baroda in India. Mark enjoys the interaction that his teaching brings at the Royal Drawing School and The Edward James Foundation West Dean.



### SANDRA SCOTT

Sandra is a textile artist, who early in her career created mixed media canvases and art quilts with themes based on her views and experiences. In her teaching practice, she works with children and adults of all abilities, sharing textile, mixed media and printmaking techniques and her infectious passion for creating.





# An overview of the English Enrichment Residential

This year, the English Residential's theme is "Unheard Voices: Rebellion and Change", designed for teachers who are passionate about exploring a greater range of voices historically underrepresented in our curriculum. You will have opportunity to engage in thought-provoking lectures, discussions and workshops. We will examine how literary works and historical events have given voice to the underrepresented, the silenced, and the oppressed. Alongside our intellectual pursuits, you can enjoy the natural beauty of Cambridge and engage in building strong connections with fellow teachers during an enriching and transformative experience.

### Objectives of the course

- » Promote consideration of why we teach English and the part it plays in the social, cultural, moral and philosophical understanding of the world we live in.
- » Cultivate ideas, within and beyond the curriculum, about reading, writing and talk, to develop in students a passion for the subject and a capacity for independent critical thinking combined with intellectual rigour.
- » Determine the significance of the literary tradition and consider the value of engaging students with challenging and influential texts as a way to promote deep and informed thinking about context, culture and the power of language.
- » Discuss and design innovative and memorable ways to engage pupils with challenging literature and literary non-fiction texts; to inspire curiosity and interest regardless of background or ability..

### **KEYNOTE SIR KAZUO ISHIGURO OBE**

Sir Kazuo Ishiguro OBE is a Nobel Prize and Booker Prize winning novelist, screenwriter and song lyricist. His internationally best-selling books have earned him many honours around the world, and *The Remains of the Day* and *Never Let Me Go* were adapted into acclaimed films. He received a knighthood in 2018 for Services to Literature.



### LAURA DOCKRILL

Laura is an award-winning writer. Her work has earned her plaudits such as Top 10 literary Talent from The Times newspaper and Top 20 hot faces to watch from Elle Magazine. Laura teaches creative writing masterclasses frequently at The Guardian.



### **MARK GRIST**

Mark is a writer and performer. Mark used to be an English teacher and Head of Year. He became Poet Laureate of Peterborough in 2008, Chief Bard of the Fens in 2009 and Edinburgh Fringe Slam Champion in 2010.



### **DR TRACY IRISH**

Tracy is an experienced teacher and theatre practitioner with a specialism in Shakespeare. She has worked with a wide range of schools and theatre companies and works regularly with the Royal Shakespeare Company and the Universities of Birmingham and Warwick.



### **DR CORINNA RUSSELL**

Corinna is a Director of Studies in English at Emmanuel College, Cambridge. She researches and teaches literature of the nineteenth and later eighteenth centuries. She has published on Romantic poets and Victorian novelists, and is working on a project about women poets and the republic.



### **PROFESSOR KIERNAN RYAN**

Kiernan is Emeritus Professor of English Literature at Royal Holloway, an Emeritus Fellow at University of Cambridge, and an Honorary Senior Research Fellow of the Shakespeare Institute. He is the author of numerous works on Shakespeare including *Shakespearean Tragedy*.

### DR HESTER LEES-JEFFRIES

Hester is Senior Lecturer in English at the University of Cambridge and has published extensively on Shakespeare and early modern literature and culture, as well as satire and tragedy, royal pageantry, and blood. She is co-creator of the 'Shakespeare Tube Map' for the RSC.



# An overview of the Music Enrichment Residential

At this year's Music Residential we are inviting you to challenge yourself to step out of your comfort zone. We invite you to experience different ways of engaging with musical material through technology, your voice and classroom ensembles, learning new skills and being inspired by others. ### **KEYNOTE SUZI DIGBY OBE**

Suzi Digby OBE is an internationally renowned choral conductor and music educator. She has founded multiple pioneering National Arts/education organisations, including The Voices Foundation (the UK's leading Primary Music Education Charity). In 2007, Suzi was appointed an OBE by the Queen for services to music education.



### **KOGG**

KOGG is an experimental electronic music duo which is a fusion of the musical influences and interests of Selena Kay and Cerys Hogg. Selena has roots in classical contemporary composition and Cerys in jazz improvisation and art. KOGG incorporates concepts from both disciplines and forges their own unique sound and approach.



#### **MAVINDER RATTAN**

Mavinder is CEO of The Voices Foundation and is the Head of Conductor training for Sing for Pleasure, the U.K.'s largest provider of choral conductor training. He established the professional chamber, choir and orchestra, Seafine Sinfonia and chamber choir in 2014, with whom he has made a number of critically acclaimed recordings.



### **DR MARY STAKELUM**

Mary is a music educator with extensive experience of teaching at school, conservatoire and university levels. She joined the Royal College of Music in 2019 to lead on music education, including the MEd in Music. She is editor in chief of Music Education Research and director of RiME, the biennial international conference on research in music education.



### **FRANCIS WINSTON**

Francis is a classically trained composer, arranger, musician (vocalist, saxophonist, clarinettist) and music teacher with over 25 years of extensive experience in both youth music education and the music industry. He is currently teaching at Haberdashers Crayford Academy in Greater London.

### **Richard Sheriff OBE**



Richard started his teaching career in Leicester before moving to Leeds as a Head of Department. Having worked as a Deputy Headteacher in a Bradford school he took up his first Headship in Leeds in 2001 before joining Harrogate Grammar School as Headteacher in 2007. Richard is a National Leader of Education and has worked as an Ofsted Inspector, but much prefers to focus on his work as Director of the Red Kite Alliance and CEO of the Red Kite Learning Trust. The Alliance is a thriving partnership of over 40 schools in the Leeds, Bradford and North Yorkshire area. The Red Kite recently became one of the first Teaching School Hubs in the country, building on over 10 years of ethical, effective and collaborative school improvement work. The Red Kite Learning Trust, a growing MAT of 13 primary and secondary schools built on the same strong collaborative values that has supported and sustained the Alliance for over ten years. Richard served as the President of the Association of School and College Leaders (ASCL) in 2018/19 and took on the role again for 2020/21 becoming the first person to hold the position twice. He has spoken widely at conferences and in the media about ethical leadership and the need for a more cohesive and collaborative school system. Richard was awarded an OBE for services to education in the 2023 New Year Honours List.

### **Sally Bacon OBE**



Sally, together with Pauline Tambling, is co-author of *The Arts in Schools: Foundations for the Future*, a new Gulbenkian Foundation report published in March 2023. Sally has spent her career championing cultural learning across the education and arts sectors. She was Executive Director of the Clore Duffield Foundation more than twenty years, where she was responsible for the Foundation's multi-million pound grant-making programme. She chaired the task force which resulted in the creation of Clore Leadership in 2004, and founded the Cultural Learning Alliance, of which she is now Co-Chair, in 2009. Before joining the Foundation, Sally studied for a PhD in English literature and the visual arts, worked as Education Officer at the Poetry Society, and as Children's Books Editor and Children's Programmes Manager for the National Trust, where she ran the Arts in Trust programme of artist residencies at Trust properties. She is a writer and editor, has been a school governor, a charity trustee, and a Museum of the Year judge. She is currently involved in setting up The Mildred Fund, which provides support for art-based learning for 14-19 year-olds across the UK. Sally was awarded an OBE in 2017 for services to cultural learning.

# The Bernice McCabe Award

The PTI's Bernice McCabe Award promotes and celebrates excellence in subject leadership, recognising departments for their exceptional leadership and impressive teacher subject expertise across the department. The £5000 prize and trophy is awarded annually to a department which is part of the Subject Leadership Programme and has demonstrated the ethos and values of the PTI through their work within and beyond the curriculum.



### 2023 Bernice McCabe winner

The Geography department at Thomas Tallis School won the Bernice McCabe award in 2023, thanks to Hannah Lees, Head of Geography, who designed and implemented an intellectually rigorous and engaging curriculum that inspires pupils of all abilities and aptitudes. Teachers' deep subject expertise and passion has become the focus of lessons that lead pupils to think deeply, rapidly building their understanding and knowledge base as well as subject specific skills.

Ambitious lessons are designed to develop pupils' global perspective simultaneously with their appreciation of the significance of geography in their local community and its relevance to their lives in real time. The sense of energy and excitement in learning has become a routine characteristic of geography lessons at Thomas Tallis School making the study of geography an attractive, revealing and essential life experience for all.
